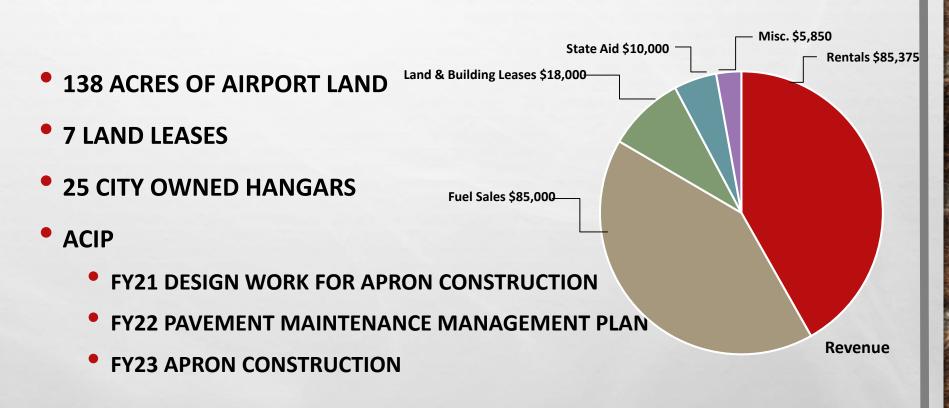

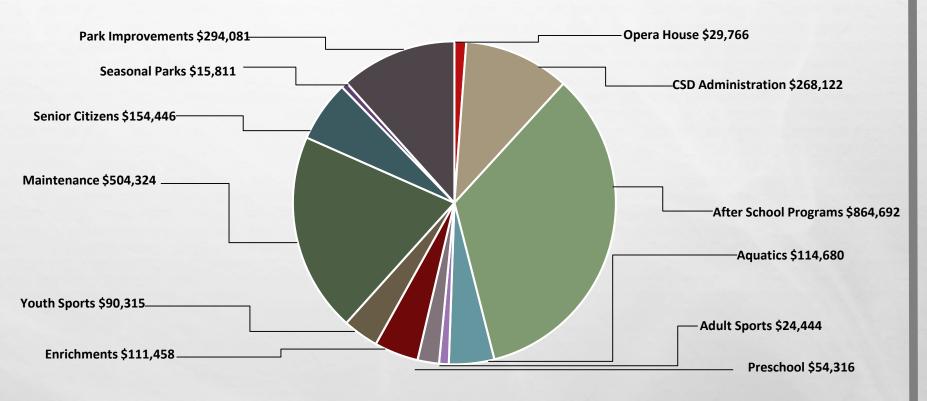
EXPENDITURES VS REVENUES



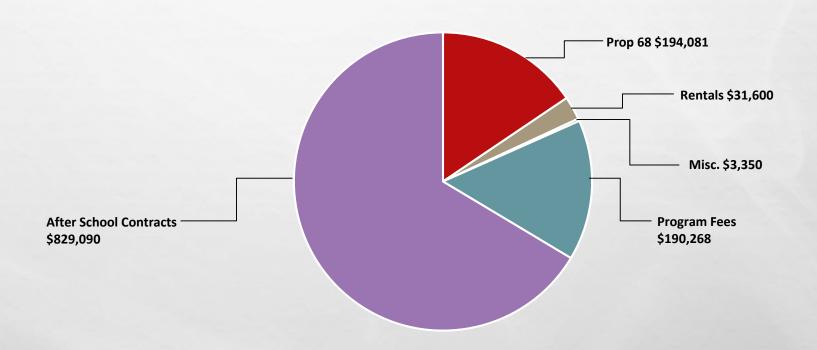

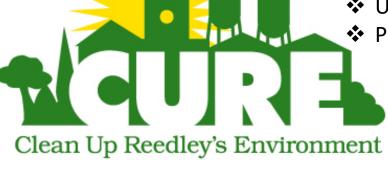

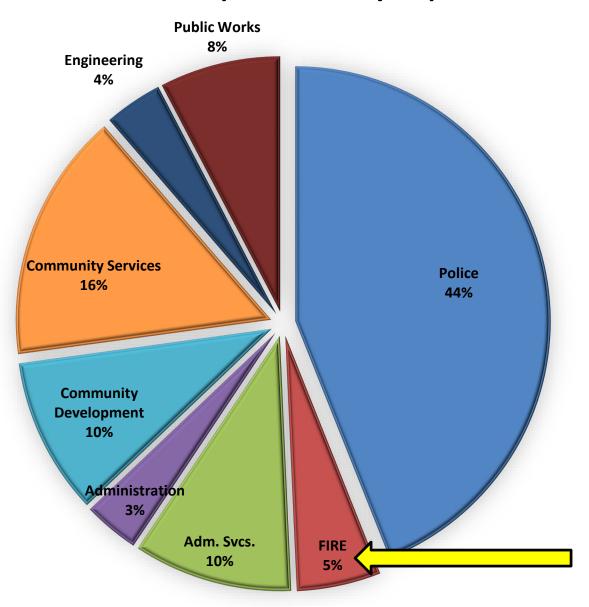

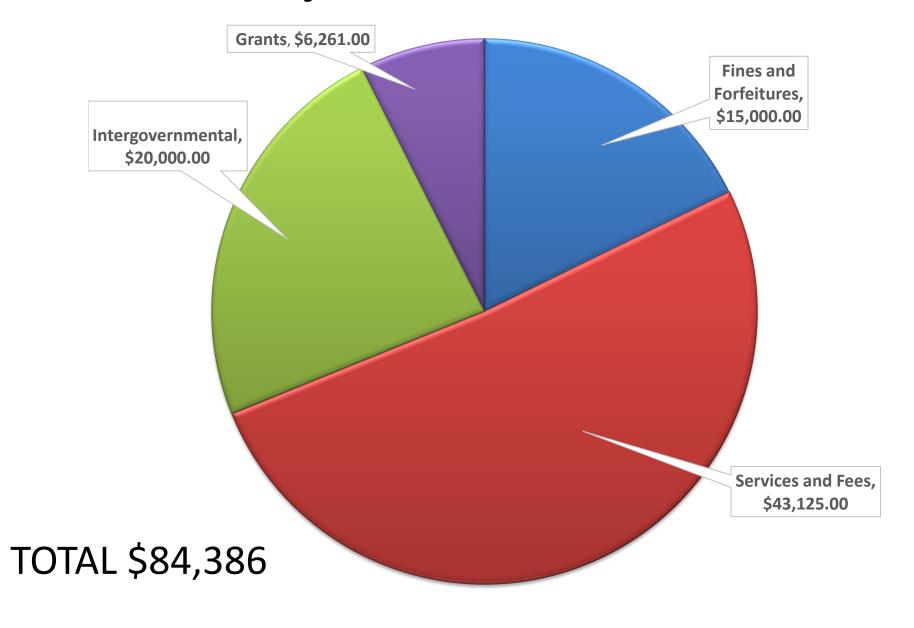


The Fire Department operational budget for FY 21/22 remains relatively unchanged. The proposed budget will maintain Fire Department operations and programs that will keep our community safe.

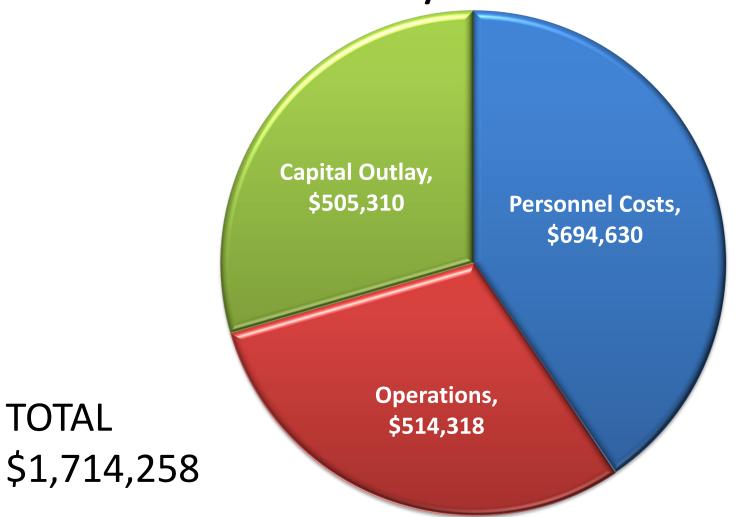
General Fund Expenditures by Department

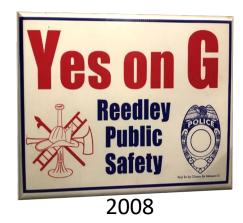
